While playing golf with Russ Friesen and Manley Bland awhile back, we encountered a situation that caused some reflection. Manley stepped up to hit a putt when he caused the ball to move with his putter. The discussion that ensued was basically, "that used to be a penalty under the old rules, but the USGA and the R&A have seen fit to remove the penalty associated with this infraction." Honestly, I was in a quandary. I knew that it had been discussed in great detail since the Dustin Johnson fiasco a year ago or so, but I wasn't sure that it had been adopted worldwide. My feeling was that this was still a penalty until the new rules are adopted next year. After research and review of a very fine article forwarded to me by J.C. Cochran, here is what I've learned. Unfortunately for Manley, while Rule 13-1d will remove this penalty as of January 1st next year, Rule 18-2 still attaches a one stroke penalty for moving the ball in play, except under certain situations. While the USGA and the R&A have granted permission for the club's rules committee to make a local rule to remove this penalty, it has not yet been incorporated into the local Rules here at TOMGC. Your board of directors did recently have such a discussion, and after discussion, decided to hold off on incorporating any new local rules until the new Rules of Golf are announced next year.
